Born on 30 November 1874, in Blenheim Palace , Oxfordshire Sir Winston Leonard Spencer-Churchill was of rich, aristocratic $\qquad$ ancestry The young Churchill passed an unhappy and sadly neglected childhood, redeemed only by the affection of his devoted nurse.

As a student at school, W. Churchill performed poorly in virtually every subject except history and English composition. He was particularly inept $\square$ at foreign languages. In a $\qquad$ , he described taking a two-hour-long Latin test that he left completely $\square$
$\square$ apart from his name and the number of the first question, along with "a blot and several smudges. $\square$ achieving such poor grades at school, Churchill's early fascination with militarism saw him join the Royal Cavalry in 1895.
W. Churchill's political career started in 1900. Throughout his life, he held nine different government offices, became Prime Minister twice, and was called the "Father of the Nation". Such a personality is indeed $\square$ of admiration. Today there's a statue of W. Churchill inside the Palace of Wesminster (aka The Houses of Parliament).

Alongside with a brilliant military career, Churchill was a versatile personality. He was very artistic and creative - being a/an avid ander a journalist, and an author throughout his entire life. He never thought of himself as an artist and $\square$ claimed landscape painting was just a hobby.

Churchill was a novelist as well. His first book was about his adventures as a war correspondent and military officer. He later $\square$ penned penned a biography of his father, a biography of the first Duke of Marlborough, a history of English-speaking peoples and a novel.

Winston Churchill was happily married. He met Clementine Hozier, the daughter of the London $\qquad$ nobles in 1908 and married her at once. Clementine became his best friend and main political counsellor since Churchill made important decisions only with her approval.

Churchill had a successful and eventful life. He died in 1965, and was honoured with a state funeral.
